I want to share yet another thing with you from my favorite meditative book called, "A Rhythm of Prayer: A Collection of Meditations for Renewal." These are two quotes that are sprinkled amidst the pages of prayers and prose.

The first comes from Anne Lamott: "I do not understand the mystery of grace - only that it meets us where we are and does not leave us where it found us."

This quote now soothes my soul as I share it with you all.
